Coal & Allied (C&A) are still pulling together their Development Application documents so the Progress Association (PA) will invite them to attend the next meeting to present to the community.

In Sawmill Camp they have bought one of the properties, they have offered Joey Warren the opportunity to buy and Mrs Bridges has moved to a nursing home.





Clearing of Site - Looking South / West

Meeting held at the Surf Club, 19th May. Committee Attendees were Sue Whyte, Damien Hawcroft, Nick Jackman (Senior Development Manager – Rose Group), Ian McNicol (AWDJohnson – Chairperson and facilitator), Glenn Gifford from National Parks, Daracon (construction contractors), as well as Kay Fraser (Councillor) from LMCC.

This Committee was set up as part of the Approval given to Rose Group to build 550 houses at the southern end of the Bay. A Committee meeting is to take place every 1 to 2 months.

Clearing work commenced April 2014 and continues over project stages 1, 2, 4 and 5, all south of Montefiore St. Bulk earthworks for Stages 1 and 2 should commence around the end of June 2014 and the anticipated commencement of Montefiore St upgrade works is end of August 2014. Works are expected to last 4 months and the road is planned to be closed for this time with public notice of the closure will be provided when dates can be confirmed.

Community Representatives raised concern of this road closure as from an emergency perspective both ends of the Bay have always been accessible from the Pacific Hwy. The Association is writing a letter to LMCC as to our objection about this proposed closure.

The Montefiore St / Pacific Hwy intersection works are anticipated to start in October 2014.

Other issues raised by Community representatives during the meeting:

- That the ridgeline "the entire length of Montefiore" is to be a "greened" ridgeline as this is part of the Approval Conditions.
- the need to maintain access to the jetty.(There will be a new Environmental Impact Study on the jetty with Expressions of Interest for adaptive reuse)
- Concerns about the proposed sewerage plant.
- The excessive speeding and burn outs of vehicles along Montefiore St, and what design was being built into this new Street to ensure that traffic speed was not going to be excessive and illegal, and an ongoing nightmare for the community.

Traffic Management

As per a phone conversation on 12th May 2014 with Peter McMurray from LMCC re; progress of implementation of the traffic calming measures – the project has been delayed due to funds being directed to other areas within the Council. As the Bay is the highest danger area in NSW in terms of speed (LMCC's traffic management consultant's words) at which vehicles travel through the town we believe that this delay is unsatisfactory. Association is to write to LMCC about our concerns.

Peter McMurray has offered to come to our next meeting.
